Born and raised in Chicago, IL, Mary Fran moved to Oregon a long time ago... long enough to fully absorb the Northwest landscape. She has had a notable career in special education for the vision impaired. Her art background includes many classes and workshops with artists of renown, including a memorable 5-day workshop with Frank Webb in Bend, Oregon, who intrigued his students with the study of colorful and interconnected positive and negative shapes.

If you ask her why she paints, she will tell you that "Making art fills some need in me that isn't fulfilled in any other way. It has been like this since childhood."

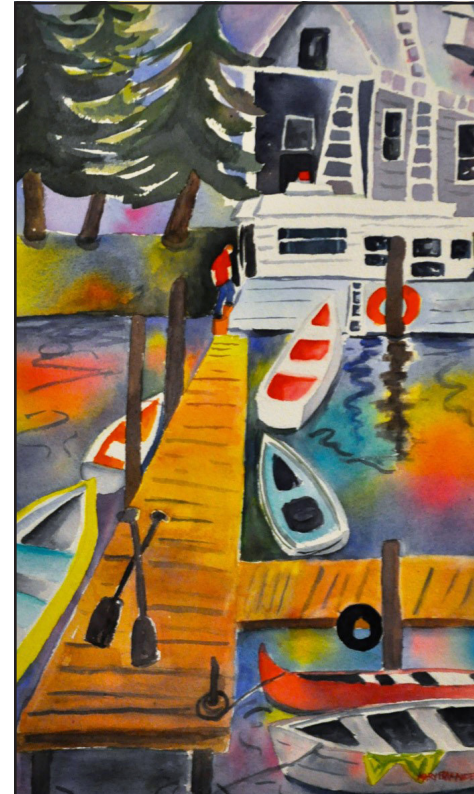

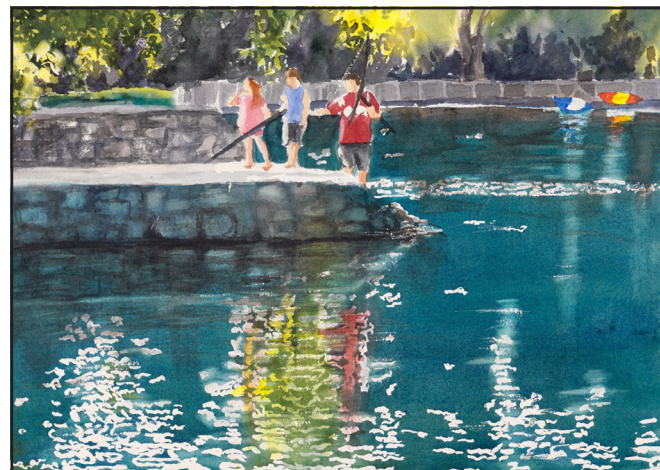
