

Philippine School Receives Books from Byrom Elementary

It took three months in transit, but Camp Lapu-lapu Elementary school is happy to report that books from Byrom Elementary School are now in the hands of the students.

The project was initiated by Philippine-based Ging Baylon of Bright Start Cebu, with the support of local Tualatin resident Marem Flores. Marem moved to Tualatin from Cebu 8 years ago. "Now the books have a second life based on the glowing smiles of the children of Cebu!" Tualatin resident Laura Stewart, volunteer librarian of Byrom Elementary School, played a big role in collecting the books. The project has created a bond between the two schools based on books and the joy of reading.

This is only the first set. There are still more distributions to come and 3 more boxes of books are currently in transit through a donation by Bridgeport Elementary School.



for them. Not that they do not want to, but because the very little income that they have (mostly as public-utility vehicle drivers) goes to food. Also, they themselves did not experience "book-reading" activities when they were young. Most of them come from poor rural areas hoping for a better life in the city.

For the past five years, Bright Start has strived to reach out and do something to change this. Through the kindness of donors, we were able to do projects such as Bright Readers wherein we have given books to children studying at public schools, day care centers and special schools. Just recently, we've launched Operation Webster with the aim of providing dictionaries and reference books to public elementary schools. Today, we want to strengthen that commitment by making December 1, 2014 through December 1, 2015 as the Bright Start Give Books- Give Love Year!
