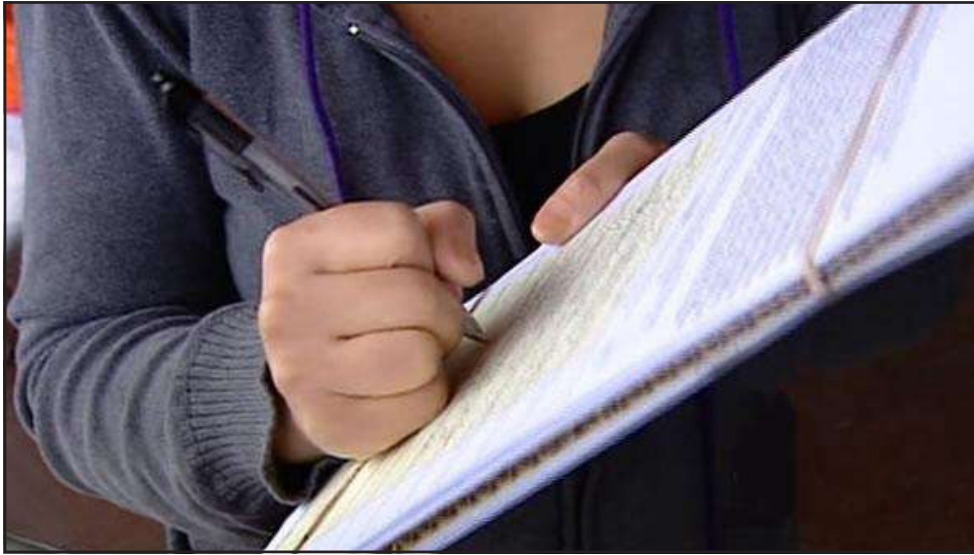


# Term Limit Initiative Gathers Enough Signatures to Qualify for Ballot



While the Tualatin City Council Term Limit Initiative qualified for the ballot, voters must wait a full year before they can vote on it.

Mae Heide, Chief Petitioner, was notified November 2nd by the City of Tualatin that the voter signatures submitted on October 23rd qualified the Charter Amendment Establishing Term Limits for the Tualatin City Council for the November 2016 election.

An ordinance passed by the Tualatin City Council after the petition was submitted on April 28 took away the right of voters to submit an initiative for the May 2016 election, which is allowed by Oregon law. Now the voters must wait a full year before voting on the question.

The petition committee submitted 2,525 signatures, well above the required

minimum of 2,109 or 15% of currently registered voters in Tualatin. According to the Petition Processing Statistics Report from Washington County, 92% of the processed signatures were accepted.
