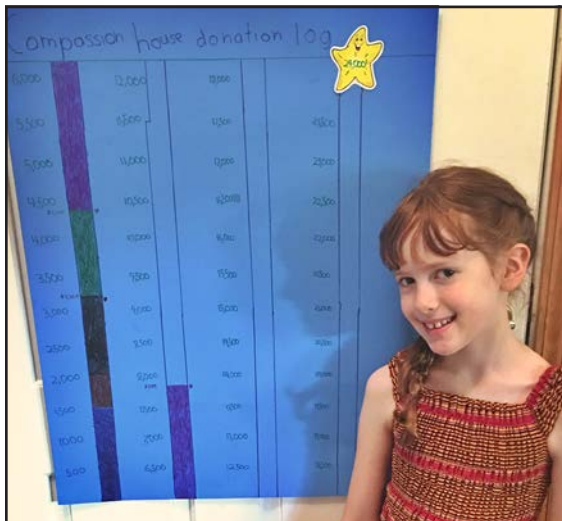


## Katie Frazer: Kid Leader

Three years ago, a then five year old Katie Frazer told her parents, Matt and Tammy, "I want to do something, but you're going to tell me I'm too little." As if that statement wasn't heart-wrenching enough, Katie expressed that what she wanted to do was raise \$1,000 to give to Village of Hope in Uganda - an organization that rescues children that were child soliders and sex slaves, as well as their orphaned siblings.

The Frazer family has a history with the Village of Hope organization, when back in 2007, Tammy Frazer (Katie's mother) was connected to the organization's founder Cindy Cunningham, through a mutual friend. Tammy started out by making blankets and sending them to Cindy to give to the children in Uganda.

Katie was born that year. So, she has grown up in a home that encourages giving and compassion for others.

The family got behind Katie's efforts, and she went over her goal - raising \$1,200. She did so by doing extra chores at home and by selling beaded necklaces, bracelets and handbags all made by women in Uganda through VoH's Tabitha Project in her Tualatin school with the full support of the school's faculty and administration.

With the success of Katie's first fundraising efforts, her dreams have gotten even bigger. Now at eight years old, Katie wants to raise \$24,000 for VoH so that they can build another home for the orphaned children of Uganda. With the help of her parents and younger brother Zachary, she has raised nearly \$8,000 just since the end of June. She struck up a conversation with people on an airplane while traveling and they gave her money for VoH. She even went to her grandmother's real estate office recently and gave a presentation about VoH. She even picks up coins she finds on the street as every penny counts. She continues to do extra chores around her house. This girl is working hard, and it is paying off.
